Using art, history, and objects in dialogue to foster mutual respect and build cultural understanding, the museum positions itself as one of the major crossroads of culture and humanity, aiming to shape new perspectives on the global history of art, highlighting connections, exchange, diversity, and tolerance.

Here, students will learn about ancient archaeological discoveries, ornate decorative arts, neoclassical sculptures, paintings by renowned modern artists, and cutting-edge contemporary installations, spanning the breadth of human history across the globe.








School Programmes



First Look




Seasonal School Programmes and Activities

Museum for Teachers

Training Programme

A series of training modules designed to help teachers develop skills and practical experience to facilitate innovative and creative engagement techniques. Each module aims to achieve specific outcomes, using the museum's collection, exhibitions, and architecture as a platform to extend learning beyond the classroom.

The training sessions are facilitated by internal and external experts and artists, where teachers work individually and with peers to explore museum-based teaching theories and strategies.



Learning Outcomes:

- UAE National Curriculum integration and implementation.
- Gain tools to implement cross-curricula learning, linking the school and museum spaces.
- Create and lead creative sessions at the museum, as well as deliver self-led activities.
- Explore object-based learning through the collection.
- Activate innovative teaching strategies and critical and creative thinking with students.

The museum's university programmes invite students to express, interpret, and discuss various contemporary and historical topics through the museum's collection and exhibitions. Depending on the programme, the activities are led by either museum educators, artists, or faculty members.

Daily Thematic Visits

Students explore how UAE culture has influenced the Louvre Abu Dhabi's architecture and investigate the connection between the UAE's surrounding natural elements and the architect's inspired museum building, from the dome to its unique structure.

Nature in Islamic Art

How is Islamic art represented across time and space?

Students use the museum's collection to explore the representation of animals and plants in Islamic art and investigate how the Islamic world influenced artistic production across time and continents.

From Silk Roads to Today

Students will discover how trade and commerce have linked different civilisations and cultures around the globe for hundreds of years. International Exhibition

Students will learn about the importance of Africa's visual and creative arts from the 11th to the 21st century, building knowledge about sub-Saharan African kingdoms and how certain materials, objects, and animals symbolise the qualities of kings and queens.

27 January-25 May 2025

Art History Walk for Universities

The Art History Walks programme offers in-depth one-hour sessions that investigate various themes within the museum. Participants learn about significant milestones in human history and understand the narrative of Louvre Abu Dhabi through the stories behind the selected themes and artworks. There are two types of series:

Discover Louvre Abu Dhabi Series

Four focused sessions, each featuring a certain epoch from the Neolithic age to the Middle Ages, the modern era, and finally the contemporary period.

Focus on Galleries 1–3: Ancient Worlds

Students explore key features from early cultures and civilisations around the world between 10,000 BCE and 5 CE, including ancient Egypt, Mesopotamia, and the Roman Empire.

Focus on Galleries 4-6: Middle Ages

Students learn about the highpoints of cultural exchanges during the Middle Ages (5 CE–1500 CE), discovering how sacred texts, religious representations, and technical and artistic innovations were spread via the Silk Roads.

Focus on Galleries 7-9: Early Modern Period

Students examine highlights from encounters between different civilisations that influenced art production from 15 CE to 18 CE. Themes include diplomacy, state image, and the fascination with travel and collecting exotic objects from the East.

Focus on Galleries 10–12: Modern Era

Students look at artistic production from the 19th to the 21st century, a period of significant economic, political, and technological advancement, including the advent of photography and film. They will discover works by the Impressionists and 20th-century avant-garde movements that challenged traditional academic standards.

Islamic Art Series

This series presents Islamic Art, showcasing a world rich in culture, art, and science, as well as examining a way of life that created a unique artistic language reflected in art and architecture throughout the Muslim world.

Introduction to Islamic Art

In this introductory session, students learn about Islamic art and what makes it special, gaining a basic understanding of this field of art while exploring the museum's Islamic Art collection.

Islamic Art Motifs

Students discover a world rich in culture, art, colour, and ornamentation, exploring Islam as a distinct culture with a unique artistic language that is reflected in its objects and architecture.

Islamic Art across Time and Space


Students investigate the vastness of Islamic lands and the extensive period of Islamic history. This encounter highlights the rich cultural and artistic developments across different regions and eras.

Islamic Art and Cultural Exchange

Students learn that Islamic art objects and artists are inherently nomadic, travelling across lands and seas, and how this mobility allowed them to both inspire and be inspired by other cultures.

University Takeover the Museum

Challenge: *Threads of Time* August to April 2025

Louvre Abu Dhabi calls upon university students across the UAE to take part in the annual University Takeover the Museum programme. This season's challenge, titled *Threads of Time*, calls on students to explore human history to highlight and address the interconnected historical and cultural events through time.

To participate, students must:

Search for threads that link different historical and cultural moments to create stories about global human development as referenced in the museum's artworks.

Design an artistic intervention, performance, interaction, activity, or research work to respond to the challenge.

Propose a project that interprets our collection and narrative as a universal museum, embracing diversity and commonalities.

Submit a project proposal endorsed by a university professor.

Select projects are activated at the museum throughout the season (2024–25).

Research Centre

Louvre Abu Dhabi's Research Centre collects material for the documentation, study, and preservation of the museum's permanent collection and supports the museum's research activities and programmes. Through the development of a library specialised in connected art historical material, electronic resources, and an artwork database, the Research Centre focuses on the encounters, transfers, and circulation of art, as well as on the history of collections and collecting. The resources, available in the museum's three official languages of Arabic, French, and English, follow an interdisciplinary approach to exploring anthropological, historical, aesthetic, and technical connections, taking a global and crosscultural perspective. The Architecture and Sustainable Design

Designed by Pritzker Prize-winning architect Jean Nouvel along the shore in a medina-like style.

There are 55 detached buildings, including 23 galleries inspired by the region's typically low-lying residential architecture.

The architecture mirrors the museum's core values of encounter and communication.

The Dome

Inspired by Arabic cupolas, mashrabiya, and palm oases.

Made up of eight layers of stainless steel and aluminium, overhung by 7,850 stars in layers, creating a unique "rain of light" effect.

It weighs 7,500 tons, almost the same weight as the Eiffel Tower in Paris, France.

It is supported by only four permanent piers, reinforcing its floating appearance.

It has a self-regulated microclimate that reduces energy consumption by protecting the buildings and outdoor plaza from sunlight and heat.

Inside the Museum

Louvre Abu Dhabi is the first of four museums on Saadiyat Island.

It was established in 2007 when the UAE and France signed an agreement for a new kind of cultural institution.

Since its opening in 2017, more than 5 million visitors and 140,000 students and teachers have visited the museum's galleries, temporary exhibition spaces, and Children's Museum.
